Did You Know


If you've ever used a cheese slicer, then you have to give thanks to a Norwegian.

The Norwegian Parliament recently issued a formal apology to Norway's indigenous people and ethnic groups including the Sami, Kvener and Finnish migrants. Norwegian state officials tried for more than a century to force them to give up their native languages, traditions and religion and become "as Norwegian as possible," but have now concluded that just wasn't right.

The previous policy was known as fornorsking. It included various forms of forced assimilation regarding religion, language and lifestyles which began as early as the 1700s and became formal state policy in 1851. It's now history.

Winter 2024-2025 Third District President's Message

As I write this message, it is Thanksgiving time and Christmas is around the corner with lodges having holiday bazaars and Christmas parties. Where has this year gone? The Third District Board and its committees have planned several exciting events for next year.

A cultural camp extended weekend (Thursday to Sunday) June 26 to 29, 2025 will be held at Isle of the Palms, South Carolina, one block from the beach. It is the Third District Board's hope that it will go over well and become a yearly event. If you are interested in going, contact Cultural Director Cheri Johnson for more information. Youth Camp will be held again at Camp Koinonia in Highland Lake N.Y. from Sunday July 20 to Saturday July 26, 2025, so if you have children or grandchildren, I strongly encourage you to have them attend youth camp next year. By now all lodges should have paid their lodge liability insurance premium as it was due November 15th. There is a \$25.00 penalty if not paid by the 15th and this penalty in my opinion is unfair. While Sons of Norway is correct in charging the penalty to those lodges that haven't paid for a long time. (some are over 2 years late and are still covered by the insurance policy), it is unfair to charge it at this time as the process for sending the insurance invoices has drastically changed. Instead of receiving an invoice by either email or snail mail, lodge officers must now log onto the Sons of Norway website, click on profile, and find the category that has the invoices, go to that category and find the invoice download it and pay it. Furthermore, the invoices were not available until Oct 19th, less than one month before when the late fee would be attached. I am happy to say that District 3 did fine for 2023 with no lodges owing money for their insurance premiums, I hope the trend will continue this year as well.

On another note, I saw on Facebook that International Board Chairman Ron Stubbings was awarded a Life Member Pin for his service as he is stepping down from the board, and as much as I would like to congratulate him on it, from what I remember when all members could be awarded Life Membership, they did not have to pay dues for the rest of their life, and with that said, how is that fair when the rest of the Sons of Norway membership had a 40 to 50 percent increase in their dues? Where is the fairness and fraternalism in that? Also, will all out going international chairmen be awarded the same for their years of service? It should be asked, what about the rest of the Sons of Norway members from all the districts who have been members for 30 or more years and are 65 plus and worked hard in many offices of the lodge, zone, and district and on many committees over the years without the stipends that is given to the International Board members. Should not they be given the same courtesy? I know this is an award that ended many years ago, but why bring it back now just for the out going International Board Chairman and chairman in the future? In my opinion this is a slap in the face for all Sons of Norway members and is very much wrong and unfair. Hopefully, this life membership award does not include having his dues paid for life, but that is what life membership has always meant. This is only my opinion, but I thought this was something that had to be said.

With that said Karen and I and the whole Third District Board would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year.
