The Gävle Goat (Julbok), a symbol steeped in Norse mythology, survived the 2024 holiday season in tact. The Gävle Goat is a giant straw goat that's erected in the Swedish town of Gävle every year on the first day of Advent to promote glad tidings.



This goat has been a tradition since 1966, but it's been the target of many attacks, including:

Fire: The goat has been burned down almost every year. In 1995 a Norwegian crossed over the border but was arrested trying to burn it down.

Birds: In 2023, wet weather left extra grain in the straw, which attracted a flock of birds that tore it apart.

Ramming: The goat was once run over by a customized Volvo.

Theft: Two men once tried to kidnap the goat with a helicopter.

Flaming arrows: The biggest culprit has been from flaming arrows shot from a distance.
